

## Community Survey on Short-Term Rental Accommodation

## Background

Some Tahsis property owners in residentially zoned areas use their homes for short term (less than 30 days) rentals, such as a guesthouse, especially during the busy May-October season. Even though some guesthouses have operated for multiple years, this use is not permitted in areas zoned R-1 and RM-2 under the Zoning Bylaw. Almost all residential areas in Tahsis are zoned R-1 and RM-2. The Zoning Bylaw, as amended, permits B&B's in areas zoned R-1, R-2 and RM-1. Short term rental accommodation providers differ from B&B's as the property owners are not usually living on-site and some of these accommodation providers may not be taxed or regulated as a business.

Short term rental accommodation, like guesthouses, potentially creates an unfair playing field for B&Bs, motels and hotels. Moreover, residents who purchased homes in residentially zoned areas can be deprived of the quiet enjoyment of their property if neighbors are using their property for an unpermitted use. Keeping this in mind, Council is considering policy options, one of which is establishing a Temporary Use Permit system with new policies and procedures, to regulate short term rental accommodation.

This questionnaire is intended to collect feedback from the public on short term rental accommodation issues. In addition, the questionnaire seeks input on a temporary use permit system for guesthouses or similar operations in residentially zoned areas. All information submitted will be kept confidential and any and all information collected which is presented publicly will be presented in anonymous aggregate form.

Since many Tahsis property owners do not live in the community year round, this questionnaire is being used to gather information from as many property owners as possible to help Council with its policy deliberations.

**A.** Short Term Rentals (STRs) is a term commonly used to describe the rental of dwellings to paying guests for commercial purposes for a period of time generally less than 30 days. This use occurs in dwellings (such as a room, apartment, principal residence, secondary suite, house or cottage) that are located in residential zones, where the common form of occupancy is owner-occupancy or month-to-month rental by tenants. The property owners are often not onsite and may not operate as a taxed or regulated business.

**C.** The *Local Government Act* empowers local governments in their zoning and/or official community plan bylaws to designate areas where temporary uses may be allowed and specify the general conditions regarding the use of temporary use permits in those areas. A Temporary Use Permit system would require persons using their property for short term rental accommodation to apply for a permit and comply with the terms and conditions of the permit. This system is used in other tourist-oriented communities in BC such as Tofino, Nelson, Revelstoke and Fernie. Council is considering using temporary use permits for regulating short term rental accommodation such as guesthouses in residentially zoned areas. Council is seeking public opinion on this policy option.
