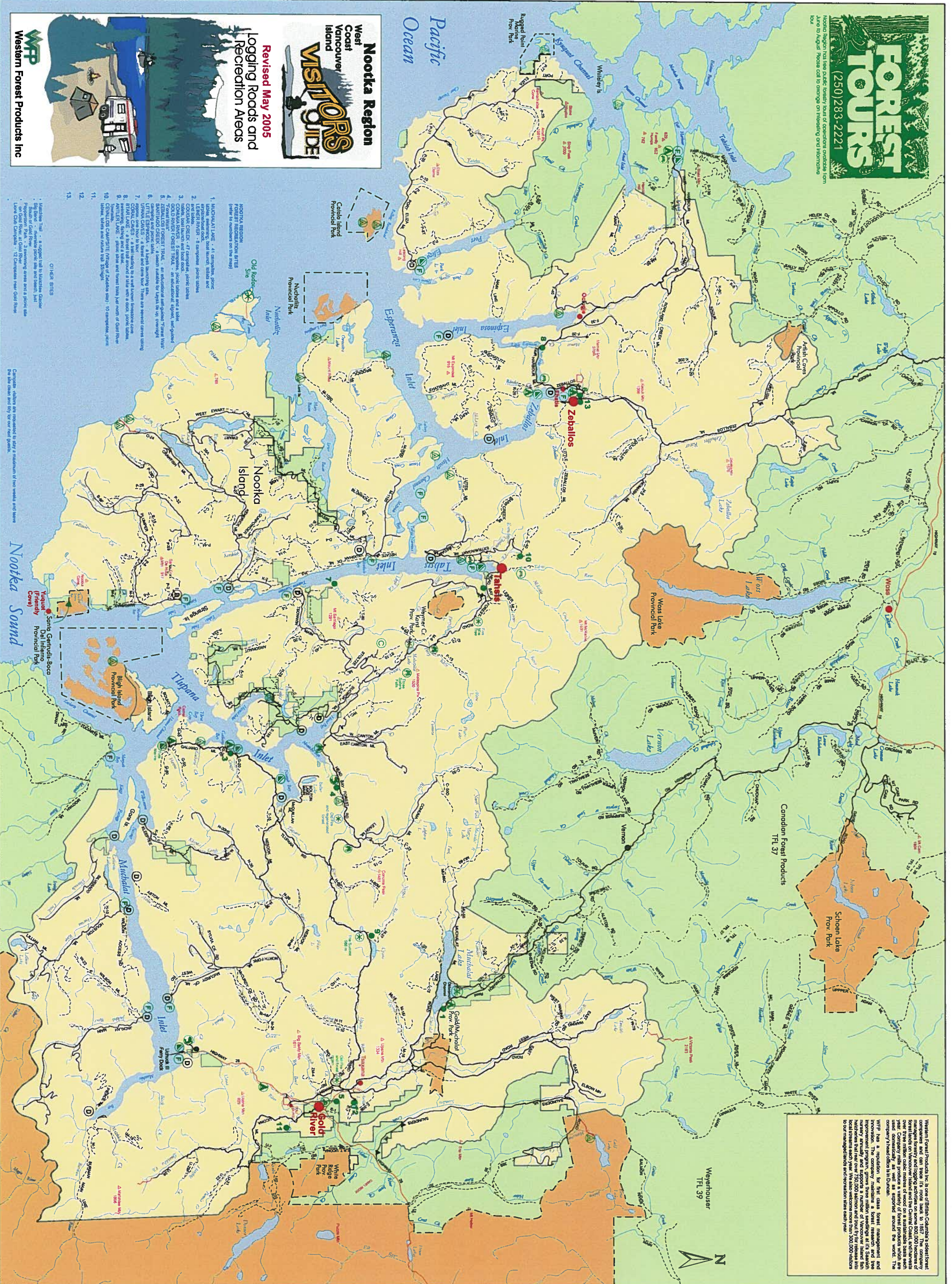

- NOOTKA REGION FOREST RECREATION SITES**  
(Refer to numbers on the map)
1. MACHUKAT LAKE - 41 campsites, picnic area, boat launch, and boat dock.
  2. ELEMEN RIVER - 8 campsites, picnic tables, boat launch, and boat dock.
  3. COXDALE CHECK - 47 campsites, picnic tables, boat launch, and boat dock.
  4. GOLD RIVER FOREST TRAIL - an educational signpost and guided trail.
  5. ZEBALLOS FOREST TRAIL - an educational signpost and guided trail.
  6. LITTLE SERRANCA - a large launching site.
  7. URMAL CREEK - a large and scenic lake. There are several camps along the shore.
  8. COXDALE CREEK - a well-kept lake with a view tower, picnic tables, swimming, fishing and a view.
  9. ANTELL LAKE - picnic sites and boat launch just north of Gold River.
  10. CEVALLOS CAMPFIRE (vicinity of Zeballos lake) - 10 campsites, picnic tables, boat launch, and view tower.

### ROAD SAFETY

Please obey all signs and use only those company roads that have been determined safe for general travel. Travel on roads leading from operation centers or log dumps to active areas is not recommended from Monday to Friday, 8 am to 6 pm.

- **LOGGING TRUCKS HAVE THE RIGHT OF WAY.**
- **IF YOU MEET A LOGGING TRUCK - PULL OVER AND STOP.**
- **DO NOT PASS HEAVY EQUIPMENT UNLESS SIGNALLED.**
- **DUST CAN SEND USLY IMPAIR VISION.**
- **MAXIMUM SPEED IS 60 KM ON WFP ROADS.**
- **PARK YOUR CAR WELL OFF THE ROAD.**

For current road information, visitors should check with a local operation at the numbers listed.

For environmental reasons, many roads are deactivated. Deactivation involves removing bridges and culverts and leaving the roads in a state where they are not suitable for 2WD vehicles. Deactivated roads are to be used with great caution and may be suitable for only 4WD, ATVs or foot traffic.

### FIRE SAFETY

Obey all fire regulations during hazardous weather. Build fires only in the pits provided and extinguish them. Do not use alcohol, kerosene, or other flammable liquids. Keep a pit of water (8 litres) and a shovel near the fire at all times. Never leave a campfire unattended. Use extreme caution with propane stoves and BBQs.
