Todd Carnahan is a conservation biologist and photographer focusing on the nature of Vancouver Island and the Salish Sea in British Columbia. He has worked in ecosystem conservation for 30 years. Todd specializes in assessing landscapes for habitat value and ecosystem function. Todd will present the best plants for landscaping and discuss how these plants can supplement purchased foods.



Nodding Onion

A drift of this long-lasting lily lures pollinators and butterflies for months. Handles salt spray, wind, drought & poor, gravelly soils. Best for dry outcrops, exposed sandy meadows & rock gardens where it spreads quickly.

Indian Plum is a tall deciduous shrub that produces small edible berries. The nutritious berries are a native food that has a delicious cherry like flavor when fully ripened.



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
