



TAHSIS SEA LEVEL RISE AND FLOODPLAIN MAPPING PROJECT

FINAL PUBLIC MEETING

By the year 2100 the seas in coastal British Columbia will have risen one meter from current levels. Sea level rise combined with other climate change events like flooding and storm surges through increased rainfall pose significant risks to the community.

The Village has completed the Flood Risk Assessment study and mapped the areas which will be affected by these events. Policy and planning recommendations for future action, including zoning changes and structural mitigation measures have been developed. These will be shared at this meeting.
